Dear Commissioner Mills,

The New York State Association for Bilingual Education (NYSABE) is the professional organization that advocates for the education of New York State's English language learners. While we congratulate the New York State Education Department (NYSED) for its initiative to revise the Learning Standards, NYSABE expresses its deep concern for the exclusion of the Native Language Arts Standards (NLA Standards) from the revision process (Regent's Memorandum of March 19, 2008).

A consistent body of research confirms that English language learner's success in second language literacy depends greatly on a sound literacy foundation in the native language. For this reason, Bilingual Education programs have as a primary goal the development of native language literacy that supports and enhances the achievement of high literacy standards in English Language Arts (ELA). Consequently, the New York State's NLA Standards, currently used in the New York State's Bilingual Education classrooms, serves as a bridge that assists students in meeting rigorous literacy standards in their native language and transferring these same skills and strategies into English.

Considering the pivotal role that native language literacy plays in the achievement of English language skills, the NLA Standards' alignment with the state's English Language Arts and English as a Second Language (ESL) Standards is of the up most importance. By mirroring the rigorous curriculum challenges and expected outcomes included in the ELA and ESL Standards, the NLA Standards supports the students' successful transition into an all English academic environment.

On behalf of the students and professionals participating in Bilingual Education programs, NYSABE requests the inclusion of the NLA Standards in the revision process initiated by the NYSED. We believe that the parallel revision of the trilogy: ELA, ESL and NLA Standards will ensure equitable access to a congruent delivery of pedagogical services for all English language learners in Bilingual Education settings.

In closing, NYSABE reiterates its commitment to ensure optimum educational opportunities for all English language learners by strengthening the spirit of collaboration among all members of the educational community.
